

GENERAL RULES

The solid black perimeter lines indicate where to cut the paper. The cut-out should be square.

Fold the paper so 1 touches 1, 2 touches 2, 3 touches 3, et cetera. Occasionally numbers will be supplemented with letters (ex: 7a and 7b). These indicate multiple points that need to touch in a single fold (ex: 7a must touch 7a, and 7b must touch 7b simultaneously).

Outlined numbers (ex: 1) are to be folded, creased, and unfolded. Overlined numbers (ex: 1̄) indicate that only the top layer of paper (and not all layers) are to be folded.

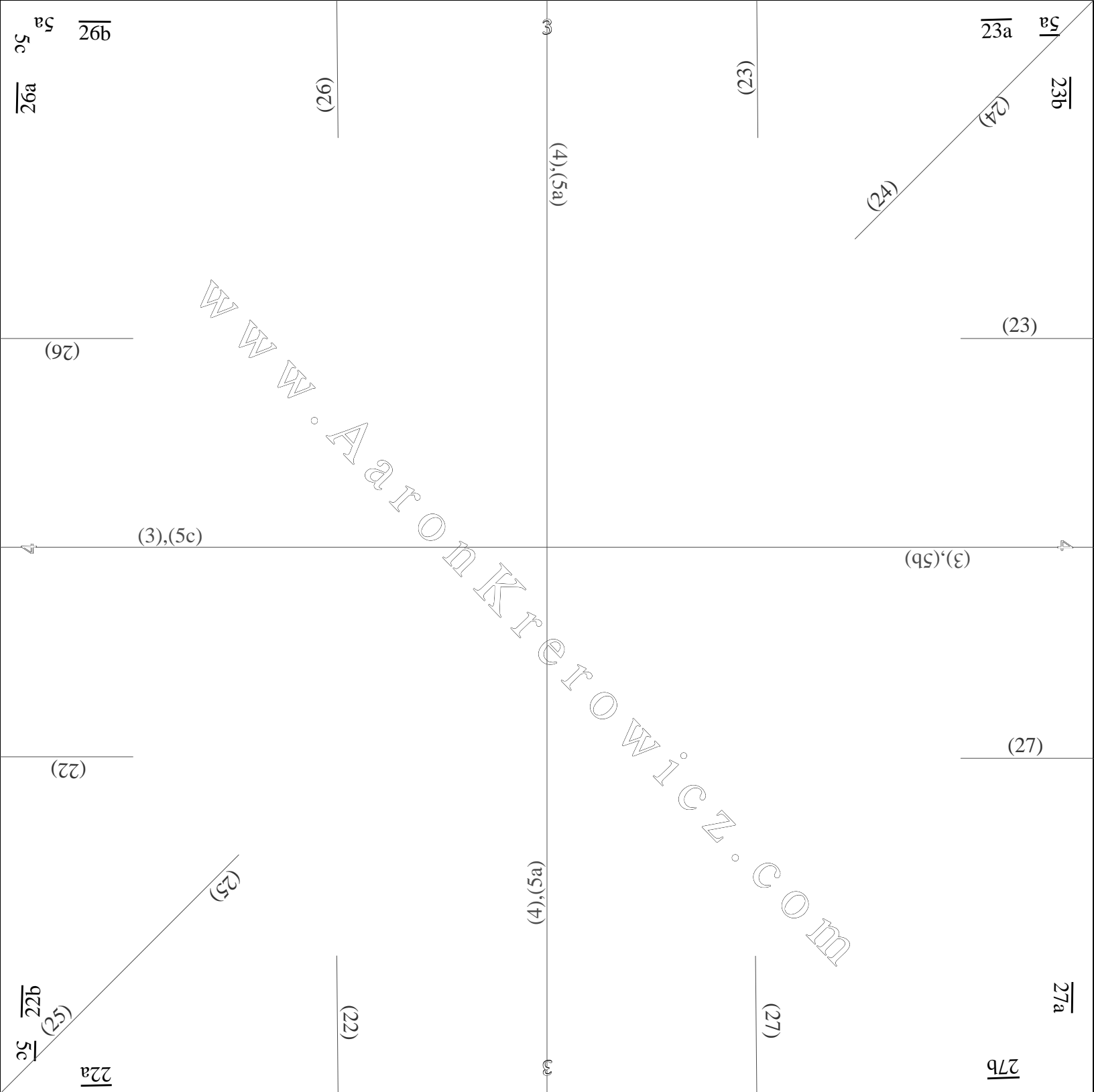
The gray lines and accompanying numbers in parentheses illustrate where each fold should crease the paper. After making each fold, double check that you did it correctly by unfolding it and ensuring the crease is in the right place.

INSTRUCTIONS

- Fold 1 to 1, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 2 to 2, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 3 to 3, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 4 to 4, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 5a to 5a, 5b to 5b, 5c to 5c, and 5d to 5d. Press flat.
- Fold 6 to 6, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 7a to 7a, and 7b to 7b.
- Fold 8 to 8, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 9a to 9a, and 9b to 9b.

- Fold 10 to 10, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 11a to 11a, and 11b to 11b.
- Fold 12 to 12, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 13a to 13a, and 13b to 13b.
- Fold 14 to 14.
- Fold 15 to 15.
- Fold 16 to 16, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 17 to 17, crease, and unfold.
- Fold 18 to 18.
- Fold 19 to 19.
- Fold 20 to 20.

- Fold 21 to 21.
- Fold 22a to 22a, and 22b to 22b.
- Fold 23a to 23a, and 23b to 23b.
- Fold 24 to 24.
- Fold 25 to 25.
- Fold 26a to 26a, and 26b to 26b.
- Fold 27a to 27a, and 27b to 27b.

Carefully open the box by sticking a few fingers into the box and spreading the base so it lays flat.
